## 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, 21 - 22 July, 2018

Readings: Jeremiah 23:1-6; Ephesians 2:13-18; Mark 6:30-34

In every life, there is need for a balanced rhythm of work and recreation. With so much pain and suffering in our world, the demands of living a gospel way of life can overwhelm us and cause us to act as though everything depends on us. While we can never really escape the responsibility of being there for those in need, today's gospel reminds us that there is a time for being out on mission and a time for being with the one who calls and sends us.

The apostles have been busy—preaching, healing and driving out the “demons” as instructed. They now report back to Jesus with an account of their activities and are invited to take time to rest and recuperate. “Come away to a desert place all by yourselves and rest a while” is the invitation that Jesus extends to them. The reference to desert evokes the wilderness of Sinai through which the people of Israel travelled for forty years. For the contemporary reader, it evokes the diversity of life in the desert, on the one hand, and the desertification of so much of the earth's surface as a result of tree-clearing and mindless destruction of forests on the other.

The “rest” that Jesus proposes is short-lived: the crowds pursue him. His response to these crowds is a physical one: he is “moved with compassion”. The Greek verb for being moved with compassion suggests a “gut” reaction in Jesus: he is physically affected in the depths of his being by the plight of the people who are “like sheep without a shepherd”, and he is ready to do something about it. As the story continues, we find Jesus inviting his disciples to accept responsibility for relieving the hunger of the people in the desert. “You give them something to eat” is his instruction to those who would turn the people away.

Like the Israelites of old, the afflicted Earth community in any age needs good leaders or “shepherds” who will “practice justice and righteousness in the land”, as the first reading from the prophet Jeremiah reminds us. The Hebrew word for justice refers to justice in the law courts. The word for righteousness is about right relationship at every level. Jesus demonstrates for his disciples and for us what justice and righteousness entail.

As the gospel story unfolds, we find that Jesus' disciples are well-meaning, though slow to learn. They are a bit like us in that. The more we take time to reflect, however, the more likely we are to respond with the compassionate heart of the “shepherd”, and the more likely we are to achieve lasting justice and right relationship in a world of unconscionable disparities and unprecedented displacement of peoples and of other-than-human species.

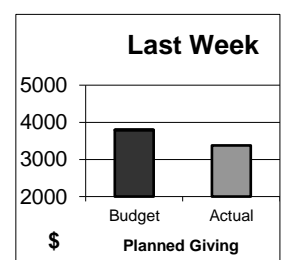
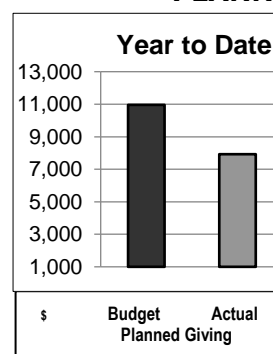
### Plenary Council 2020:

## Reduce Reuse Recycle

On Thursday 5 July a small group of parishioners met with Dianne Pasfield, Senior Water and Waste Educator from the Toowoomba Regional Council (TRC), to discuss managing waste. Each Council area in Australia has different procedures about waste and recycling so it's important to know the local rules about what can and can't be recycled and which bin to use.

This meeting was timely as from 1 July this year, we have all had to deal with the removal of single use plastic bags in Queensland. This is a response in part to the growing volume of waste plastic objects clogging up our waterways. It appears that within 12 years there will be more plastic objects by weight than fish living in our oceans unless action is taken.

Pope Francis in his encyclical, *Laudato Si*, stressed our common responsibility to care for our environment. Unfortunately, Australia is ranked 5th highest for generating the most municipal waste in the world.

So, what can we do to help solve the waste problems confronting our world?

1. **Reduce** our consumption of consumer goods. Think before we buy.
2. **Reuse** existing goods instead of replacing them.
3. **Recycle** items that are of no further use to us. From this weekend St Thomas More's recommences providing a bin for battery recycling.
4. **Collect** TRC's 3 wheelie bin bookmarks from the church foyer and always place the correct items only in the red, yellow and green bins so that our recycling system is not contaminated.
5. **Watch** the *War on Waste* on ABC TV commencing Tuesday 24 July at 8.30 to learn more about the problems and possible solutions.
6. **Support** local not for profit op shops. Put reusable items in the St Vincent de Paul bin or take larger items to the shop in Ruthven Street. Give used books to the Lifeline Bookshop at the Range Shopping Centre.
7. **Spring Clean** and collect unneeded items for St Thomas More's Spring Clean Garage Sale on Saturday 8 September (more details below).

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Subsequent to the presentation on July 5, Dianne provided further information from Toowoomba Regional Council about the disposal of batteries:

*"While alkaline batteries can be safely disposed of with normal household waste, there are a large range of batteries that contain harmful chemicals like heavy metals such as lead, mercury and cadmium which can escape into the environment. This contamination can be dangerous for the environment and for human health. There is also the issue of batteries causing fires. We have had to deal with fires caused from batteries in the waste collection trucks and also at the Waste Management Centre.*

*Button batteries contain toxic chemicals and should never be disposed of in general waste. As a result of the confusion as to which batteries can be safely placed in general waste and which cannot, we discourage any batteries being placed in the General Waste bin."*

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### Spring Clean Garage Sale 8 September 2018

We are holding a Parish Spring Clean Garage Sale on Saturday September 8 in the hall (and outside if necessary). This is a fundraising event for the parish, so you are invited, as you prepare for spring and have a clean up at home, to donate any items that you no longer need to the Parish to be sold on the day. Any items not sold on the day will be donated to the Society of St Vincent de Paul or to Lifeline. As part of the day, we are planning to include a plant sale so would welcome the donations of plants. If you prefer, you can donate pots or potting mix so that we can organise for some plants to be potted for selling on the day. The day will also include a cake stall, with donations of cakes and other baked goodies invited. The sale will be advertised to the broader community and we are looking forward to a great day.
