Fourth Sunday of Lent ~10th March 2024

Ephesians 5: 8-14 "You were darkness once, but now you are light in the Lord"

My favourite childhood movie was Disney's "Beauty and the Beast". I could recite from memory every song and every line from the film. One such line that stands out to me, (among my many favourite quotes) Belle says to the Beast "come into the light". This is once Belle seeks to rescue her father from the prison in the castle, and upon meeting the Beast, a huge and ferocious character, he stands in the shadows and she offers to replace her father as the prisoner in the castle, but before Belle makes this deal she asks for her captor to "come into the light". Now the film goes on to have Belle melt the heart of the Beast with her kindness and they fall in love and only then does she break the spell...sorry I should have prefaced this with a spoiler alert! But it has been around since the 90's!

What has this got to do with the readings this weekend? This 4th Sunday of Lent, has a choice of using year B readings or using year A readings. The readings we are hearing at mass this weekend is year A, as referenced, but when studying the readings Jn 3:14-21 is the Gospel passage and this stood out to me:

"that though the light has come into the world

men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil.

And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed;

but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light,

so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God"

It rings so true! We are quick to condemn even our own actions, but it is difficult to live in the light, be transparent and genuine to ourselves and in our relationship with others and God. We want to cover up our wrong doings, lie about it or fix it before we are found out, but in the end, living honestly is the only way.

This is echoed by St Paul's letter to the Ephesians that we hear today. To hide in the dark, is not how we are called to live. St Paul implores us to be children of the light, that by living as Jesus has instructed us to is in stark contrast to the dark. By bringing the light into the world we can change the hearts of others, even Beasts.

As we go about our life this week, I implore you to live your life in the light. Don't be blind to what God is calling you. May this Eucharist bring us closer to the light of Christ and bring us out of blindness and darkness.
