Fifth Sunday of Lent ~17th March 2024

"Oh don't be a martyr!" Have you ever heard someone say this expression when they want you to stop what you are doing? Maybe they think you do too much? Or that it is a warning for you to know when to back off before imminent failure. Or that you are always putting yourself through suffering. Whatever the reason for saying that, it doesn't come across as positive affirmation.

However, being a martyr is an act of selfless heroism. At the heart of our faith, is the cross, the symbol of Jesus dying for us! There is no greater sacrifice than that. When we talk of becoming like Jesus, sacrifices are a part of that. We need to fall on the ground and die before we can yield a rich harvest. The Saints that we look to that were martyred sacrificed their lives but sacrifices are to be made consistently in our lives as Christians.

By comparison we have it easy today, but martyrdom comes to all believers in different ways. In the broadest sense a martyr is one who is prepared to pay the price for holding true to Christ. For us now, this might mean making serious choices about the company we keep, the business ventures we enter into, the non-violent protests we mount, foregoing luxuries so that others in our world might have necessities, and even remaining faithful to the vows and promises we have made. Christian faith sometimes bites hard, and when it does, we know we are sharing in the martyr's lot.

And what should be our response when our faith in Christ costs us something big? Jesus models it for us in today's Gospel, '...what should I say? "Father, save me from this hour." No, it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name.'

May this final week of Lent, see us actively seek out ways of sharing in the martyr's lot by letting go of what is not essential and focusing on the One who loved us to the end.
