<u>LOVE</u>

Many a book, film, poem and song has been written about love. It is a small word but represents so much. We give love, show love, fall in love. It surrounds us, consumes us, it lifts us up. Love is not all warm and fuzzy feelings and happily-ever-after's. It is a choice we have to make, every chance we get.

The Gospel today tells us of the sacrificial nature of love. "*No one can have greater love than to lay down his life for his friends.*" If we consider this deeply, we see that Jesus goes beyond this because he gave his life for both friends and foes. What a difference is there now between this faithful love of Jesus and other kinds of false and fickle love. This is a challenging way of working out who we really love, isn't it? The people we love are those for whom we are prepared to sacrifice something of ourselves, maybe everything.

If that's the case, we could decide to stop telling people we don't love that we love them. The goal of the Christian life is to know the fullness of love, and in doing so, the ideal is to love everybody, but until we achieve that, the more we lie about love the more we lower its currency. It's perfectly acceptable to like, enjoy, be fond of, respect, admire and be grateful to others, and not love them. There are a very few people for whom most of us would be prepared to lay down our lives.

We could also decide to stop saying we love things, animals, ideas or organisations which cannot love us back. Human beings can only truly love people. Jesus did not die for an ideology or an institution. He was put to death because of his uncompromising love for all humanity everywhere. If we find ourselves saying we love our pets, house, car, job, hobbies, our ideology, even our Church more than we love other human beings, then we're in trouble!

St Thomas More wrote, in 'A Treatise upon the Passion, Christ's love unto the End'; "Who can be sure of many of his friends when our Saviour himself was, at his capture, left alone and forsaken by his?... Let us in time, then, learn to love as we should, God above all things, and all other things for him. ... For whatever we love that makes us break God's commandment, we love better than God,

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26,34-35,44-48: *The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the gentiles also.*

Second Reading: 1 John 4:7-10 God is love.

Gospel: Jn 15:9-17: No one can have greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. and that is a love deadly and damnable."

My prayer this week is that we seek to be sincere in our love and come to know the fullness of the love of God.
